## Regeneration of Derelict Area to create a Bluebell Wood

This area has been cleared by volunteers to make way for a new hedge and the planting of flower bulbs, including bluebells, primroses and other woodland plants so that the woods become a beautiful and peaceful place to be enjoyed by one and all. It is hoped that the area will attract wildlife and offer the opportunity for generations of children to learn about nature.

The following species have been planted to create the hedge:-

### Primary species

Carpinus betulus – Hornbeam  
Crataegus monogyna – Hawthorn  
Prunus spinosa – Blackthorn

### Secondary species

Corylus avellana – Hazel  
Euonymus europaeus – Spindle  
Acer campestre – Field Maple  
Taxus baccata – Yew  
Viburnum opulus – Guelder Rose

### Tertiary species

Ilex aquifolium – Holly  
Frangula alnus – Alder Buckthorn  
Rhamnus cathartica – Buckthorn  
Cornus sanguinea – Dogwood
