Adam Barnes, a local butcher, and two accomplices broke into Calverton Manor, September 1694. They were disturbed by Grace Bennett who they brutally murdered. They were captured in Grove Wood, Beachampton, and tried at the Cross Keys Inn, Stony Stratford. After execution by hanging their bodies were exhibited on a gibbet behind the
