when the building became an orphanag

This closed in 1963 and became a Franciscan Prep. School for a few years until it was bought by a property developer. It is now mainly residential but also houses a restaurant and several businesses.



In 1969 "om McClean, a "lad" from Fegan's Home, rowed single handed in "Super Silver across the Atlantic Ocean in a record time of 70 days. He rowed the Atlantic again in 1982 in "Citispur", in 55 days. This boat is now in the Exeter Maritime Museum.
