### Historic Market Square



The Market Square in the early 1900s. In the background is the tower of St Clies Church. This church was rebuilt and enlarged in 1776 to accommodate parishioners after St Mary Magdalen Church burnt down in 1742.

This early photograph shows the Wesley Firm, John Wesley made five visits to Stony Stratford during the late 18th century and is reputed to have preached from the shade of this elm tree.

The shop on the right, now occupied by Cox & Robinson is one of the oldest firms in the town, c. 1760.
